

Notice of an enduring power of attorney

Note: The notes in this form are provided by way of guidance only and do not constitute a statement of the law or the provisions under the Assisted Decision-Making (Capacity) Act 2015 (as amended) or any ancillary or related legislation.

Note: This notice must be given to the following persons:

- The spouse, civil partner or cohabitant (if any) of the donor
- Any adult children of the donor
- Any existing decision-making assistant, co-decision-maker, decision-making representative, or designated healthcare representative for the donor
- Any existing attorney in another enduring power of attorney, or in an enduring power of attorney made under the Powers of Attorney Act 1996
- Any other person named by the donor in the enduring power that would be given notice

Under section 71(1) and (2) of the Assisted Decision-Making (Capacity) Act 2015 (as amended) (the Act), you may object to the enduring power of attorney **within 5 weeks of the date of this notice**. You may object to this enduring power of attorney on one or more of the following grounds:

- The enduring power of attorney or instrument creating it is not in accordance with section 59, 60 or 63 of the Act
- The notice requirement of section 68(3) of the Act was not complied with
- The donor lacks capacity
- Fraud, coercion or undue influence was used to induce the appointer to execute the instrument creating the enduring power of attorney
- A false statement is included in the instrument creating the enduring power of attorney or the application to register the instrument
- The attorney, or one of the attorneys, is not a suitable person within the meaning of section 59(6) of the Act.

Objections can be submitted to the Director of the Decision Support Service via the website decisionsupportservice.ie/objections or via the Decision Support Service online portal **myDSS** which can be accessed through the website. To make an objection you must quote the unique reference number above and pay the prescribed fee.
